- 7. What in the story of Noah indicates that he was a good husband and father?
- 8. Describe Noah with respect to his religious devotions? (Genesis 8:20; Hebrews 11:6,7;
 2 Peter 2:5,9; 1 Peter 3:20; Ezekiel 14:14,20)
- 9. What sin did Noah commit? (Genesis 9:20,21)
- 10. What unique distinction does Noah have among all men? (Genesis 9:19; 10:1,32)
